- 1. What is the general aftermath of the "feast"?
- 2. How do Piggy and Ralph feel about the events from the previous night? Be sure to address how both characters feel.
- 3. What do Samneric have to say about the *feast*? How do Piggy and Ralph react?
- 4. What position has Piggy taken in all of this? How does he feel about the events and what is to come? *Use a quote for support.*
- 5. "Sitting on the tremendous rock in the torrid sun, Roger received this news as an illumination. He ceased to work at his tooth and sat still, assimilating the possibilities of irresponsible authority." What has Roger realized at this point?
- 6. How does the author identify the members of Jack's tribe at this point? Why might he do this?
- 7. What is the double function of the fire?
- 8. What happens to Ralph's tribe at the end of the chapter?

## **Conflict Analysis:**

There are three different types of conflict that we are going to look at: **man vs. man; man vs. self; and man vs. nature.** In a paragraph response, choose one character and outline the type of conflict they are experiencing in the book up to this point. *Use quotes for support*.
